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PART A

Plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the academic year for quality enhancement

St.Joseph's College, in its tireless pursuit of academic excellence decided to chalk out a detailed five year plan for the period 2007–2012 keeping in mind the vision and mission of the institution, particularly its obsession with the quality sustenance. The detailed plan submitted by the departments of the college for the year 2010-2011 is given below:

1. Higher Focus Course:

As a sustained effort to realize the vision and mission, the college, it was decided to continue the three-year Composite Empowering Training Programme – the Higher Focus Course - this year also, which includes training in skills related to driving, yoga, self-defence, personality development, computer, internet, career guidance, ethics etc. and to issue certificates to those who complete the course successfully.

2. Bridge Course:

A three-day orientation course was decided to be given for the First Year Degree entrants from 16-07-2010 in order to make their transition from the Higher Secondary to the University level education quite jerk-free. The new skill development approach to university education and their goal orientation, the attitude and preparedness it calls for on the part of the students will form a major part of the course content. The talks given in this regard will touch the innumerable facilities, resources and support services available to the students in the college and the ways in which they can benefit out of them.

A session of the course will be set apart for the parents who will be briefed on the changing environment in which their wards are trained in the campus and the demands the new set up makes on them by way of co-operation with the teaching and non-teaching staff and the management. Moreover, they will also be informed of the need of inculcating professional skill in their wards which alone can enable them to face the stiff competition, in professional excellence at the global level. Over and above the usual working hours of 9.15 a.m. to 3.15 p.m., the students will be retained in the campus for an hour more in the evenings for imparting special soft skills they should acquire for the above purpose.

3. Remedial, Career Guidance and Soft skill courses:

Remedial, Career Guidance and Soft skill courses will commence during the first month of the first term itself without fail.

4.UGC Funded Innovative Programme in Emerging Areas:

The one year Diploma Course in Cryptography conducted by the Department of Mathematics under the above scheme of the UGC will be converted into a two-year PG Degree course in Cyber Security and the first batch to the new course will pass out in 2010-11.

5. Enrichment and Other Courses

(a) UGC sponsored add-on courses

The existing UGC sponsored add-on courses in Communicative English, will focus on increasing the number of participating students. Two add-on courses, one on Yoga-Health Management and the other on Gemmology sanctioned by the UGC under its financial support also started functioning in the year 2010-11.

(b) Enrichment, Certificate and Diploma Courses:

Appropriate Enrichment Courses in various skills in order to equip the undergraduate students to stand out in the job market scenario will also be held as usual. It has been decided to train every student of the first degree course at least in one certificate course as an innovative part of the programme. A list of the proposed courses is furnished below:

- vii. Special Wednesday Prayer session of one hour.
- viii. Inter- religious dialogues and retreats

7. Advance Curriculum Planning: Subject-wise and Teacher-wise

Advance Curriculum planning will be done as usual by every Department, subject-wise and Teacher-wise, and the plans will be handed over to the IQAC and the Academic Excellence Committee for monitoring purpose. The Curriculum planning is done in such a way as to ensure that the syllabus is covered in full by the end of the second term and the rest of the working days are set apart for revision exercises and examination oriented test papers.

8. ICT Enabled Teaching & Learning:

The teachers will be specially urged to make use of ICT devices or gadgets and Internet in class room teaching to ensure that the lecture content of the classes is brought down to the minimum thereby ensuring the active participation of the students in the teaching process.

9. Academic flexibility:

Adequate academic flexibility will be provided by introducing course options for the students to choose from. The option facility will be made available also in Indian languages offered as second language. In the case of add -on -courses also a wide range of option facility will be ensured.

10. Coaching Classes:

Special Coaching classes will be arranged for PG students of June/December examinations of JRF and NET. Coaching classes for Civil Service Preliminary Examination, PSC Examination and Bank Test will also be arranged.

11. Student Feedback:

Student Feedback will be obtained on the following:

a)Teacher Performance (b) Student expectation of the courses (c) Student expectations about the college (d) Student evaluation of the Management and administration of the college (e) Student evaluation of the Performance of the Principal (f) Student evaluation of the performance of the non-teaching staff (g) Student evaluation of the learning resources like Library and ICT facilities (h) Student evaluation of the facilities offered for co-curricular activities like sports and cultural activities (i) Student evaluation of the infrastructure facilities (j) student evaluation of the examinations – both internal and external (k) Student evaluation of the performance of the Grievance Redress Cell.

12. Admission Process:

The process of admission to various courses, both aided and unaided, will be in strict conformity with the relevant rules and regulations laid down by the Government and University in this regard. In order to ensure maximum transparency, the admission rules and regulations will be published in the prospectus and the website of the college for the information of the public. The admission policy of the Management will be by and large inclusive.

13. Post Entrance Test (PET):

In order to cater to the diverse requirements of the various levels of learners, the students will be categorized into two categories – advanced learners and impaired learners - by means of a Post Entrance Test (PET) to be conducted on 16-07-2010.

14. Teaching & Learning:

The avowed intention of the college during the year will be to make learning and teaching process more and more learning and learner centered. Ample opportunities will therefore be offered to them to fend for themselves in the learning process by methods of seminars, symposia, presentations, assignments, mock viva voce, quiz, study tours, talks, special library sessions etc.

20. Refresher Courses:

Updating will be viewed as a very important teacher function, and for this purpose the faculty will be urged to attend refresher/ orientation courses and seminars and symposia. Maximum efforts will be made to make available to them participation allowance for which there is provision in the UGC grants. This will be specially looked into in the case of teachers who have received invitations from outside agencies or institutions for paper presentation, talks, classes etc. As usual, they will be entitled for legitimate leave with pay for their participation in such updating sessions.

21. Paper Publication:

Assistance will be considered also for the publication of the teachers. This year the college or the sponsoring agencies it finds out will publish at least two research books prepared by the teachers. It has also been decided that every faculty shall publish at least one paper this year.

22. Innovative Methods:

Since the college is an affiliated one, it is not free to bring about any kind of reforms in testing or examination system practised by the University. However, the college intends to make use of innovative techniques like test with books, peer evaluation, oral tests, on-line tests, etc. in its internal assessment.

23. Administrative Efficiency

To enhance administrative efficiency it has been planned to organize workshop for the faculty and staff, guided by resource persons from offices of the concerned government departments or the University. The first of these seminars will be held during the midsummer vacation of the academic year 2010-11 in which the entire administrative staff will take part. Short courses in soft skills also will be arranged for the benefit of the staff. The schedule of this year's seminars is follows:

Seminar for faculty: 20^{th} June, 2010 Seminar for Staff : 21^{st} July, 2010

24. Curriculum Designing

Curricular restructuring is an important exercise in which the teaching staff of the college should take an active part, and with this end in view departments will be persuaded to hold faculty discussion on the suggestions to be submitted to the University as and when such deliberations take place in the University. The Department will also consult the industry in this matter so that the syllabus ultimately turns out to be responsive to their needs. The faculty membership in University bodies related to this area will be encouraged and teacher participation in their deliberations will be ensured. Seminars/workshops organized on syllabus restructuring by bodies other than Universities will also receive attention. The

faculty will also be urged to interact effectively with the newly formed higher education council and to submit suggestions for reforms proposed by the council.

25. Consultancy

A consultancy Cell is proposed to be set up in every Department to promote institution/industry interface to the maximum extent possible. Surplus expertise available in the Department can then be successfully canalized for societal requirement. Consultancy has not been a strong point of the college for long and with the implementation of the present plan, things are expected to take a turn for the better. The Cell will identify pockets in need of the expertise we can offer, and this will widen the consultancy net-work of the college to an amazing extent.

26. Project Undertaken:

The thrust on research will be accentuated by raising the number of projects departments undertaken with financial support from external agencies. At the beginning of every year, a special workshop will be convened for this purpose, especially to chalk out major projects that are very few in the college now. Funding agencies other than the UGC will be approached for this purpose. And the Departments will be persuaded to give adequate consideration for the major projects. It is expected that the following faculty members will apply for Major/minor projects this year:

27. Linkages

Adequate number of academic and research linkages will be developed during the year under review to widen the reach and scope of enquiry of the student and teacher community. Though the college at present has linkages with a number of institutions, these links are not

bound by necessary documentary support. Efforts will be made also to get into Memoranda of Understanding in the case of these linkages.

28. Infrastructure:

New infrastructure facilities for new courses like Master of Journalism and Communication, Master of Social Work and Cyber Security have been provided at a cost of a crore of rupees.

29. IT Facilities:

The LAN facility will be inaugurated very soon. Internet facilities will also be stepped up enabling students and faculty to make maximum use of the facility. Internet facilities will be made available in all research departments.

30. Library:

The number of books in the library will be raised to 70000. Number of journals and periodicals subscribed will be raised to 400 and the number of educational CD's in the library will be raised to 600. The reprographic facilities will be improved.

The service of the library will be extended to the people beyond campus limits in order to make it to be of service to lay men as well. A book bank facility is also mooted. The working hours of the library will be enhanced by an hour every working day.

31. Website:

The college website will be updated with information on the support given to the aspiring students. This information will also be provided in the college prospectus, brochures, handbook and advertisements published by the college. Personal counselling will also be provided in this matter, if required.

32. IQAC

The IQAC functioning in the college will issue special handouts inviting attention of the students to the various facilities offered to them in the college.

33. Academic Calendar:

The teachers will speak to the students on the curricular plans at the opening of the first session of every course. An academic schedule will be issued to them on the first day of the course detailing the work plan of the year/semester. This will include also the code of conduct and behaviour expected from the students.

34. Central Monitoring Cell

The central monitoring cell functioning in the college will come to the help of the students in all areas and sort out problems students face related to the University, Government and other Institutions. The academic counselling facilities available in the college will be further stepped up.

35. Sports & Cultural Events:

Recreation, cultural and sports facilities intended for the students will be further augmented. Special training for cultural competitions will be arranged in order to enable them to successfully compete in the inter-collegiate and state level competitions. In sports and games also those interested will be given excellent training. Specialized coachers will be made available to all the students interested in Sports and games. Attempts will be made to secure sanction for a sports hostel for the higher secondary students also.

36. Alumnae

The college alumnae will be called upon to extend assistance to the present students by donating generously to the various curricular and co curricular programs organized for them. The alumnae will also contribute generously to provide housing for a homeless student. They have already provided scholarships for a few needy students under the auspicies of the Botany alumnae. They will also train the neighbouring community in various instant food manufacturing techniques and their marketing.

37. Entrepreneurial Development Club

The Entrepreneurial Development Cell will keep on motivating the students to take up self employment schemes on completion of the course. For this purpose, the students will be familiarized with the governmental policies, programs and proposals for women self employment including the support from banks and other financial institutions.

38. All Round Development:

Opportunities for leisure time activities will be provided for the students through involvement in nature club, publication of magazines and journals, participation in cultural programs, production of audio visual clippings related to educational and recreational domains.

39. Communal Harmony

All religious festivals will be appropriately observed in the campus with a view to promote among the students communal harmony and respect for all religions.

40. Community Programmes:

Available surplus space will be utilized for programs of outside agencies such as National Youth Forum, Women organizations, CASP activities, career guidance, Yoga practices etc. During holidays and after college hours on week days, the college premises will be utilized for examination of public service commission, Hindi Prachara Sabha etc.

41. Film Club

A film club will soon be begun in the campus which would promote production and exhibition of short films of art value.

42. Community Awareness:

To create community service awareness among the students and in order to make them aware of the realities apart from the main stream activities like NSS, NCC, AICUF, Social Service, Women's Cell, Free Medical Camp etc. a number of other activities will also be carried out as detailed below.

- a. CASP, CSS, Reach out programs will include programs like visit to the Home for the Aged, Home for physically and mentally challenged, Hospitals, Prisons, Rehabilitation centers and Orphanages.
- b. As part of the student support and progression programme Darsana, the college counselling centre will continue to provide professional aid to solve the personal problems of the students, their families and the community. Darsana will also extend its services to the *Alcoholic Anonymous, Mathruvedi and Youth*. Seminars and classes related to these are planned for this year also.
- c. Some of our faculty and staff are involved in the extension activities such as volunteers of crisis intervention centers and Lok Ayukth. More members of teaching staff will be urged to take up social responsibilities of this sort.
- d. Departmental associations and related clubs will plan various activities to motivate the students to excel in curricular and co-curricular activities.
- e. Freshers' day, Union Inauguration Day, Talents Day, Fine Arts Day, Sports Day, College Day, Foundress Day, Alumni Day, Parents Day, Community Day, Teachers Day, Women's Day etc along with festivals and other days of national importance will be celebrated in a befitting manner this year also.

- f. The 'Student of the Year' competition is to be conducted in a unique way with several rounds of tough screenings.
- g. Farewell programs for the undergraduate and postgraduate students will be arranged at the academic year end or semester end as usual.

43. Association Activities

- To promote a sense of solidarity and oneness among the faculty and staff, picnics, staff day celebrations and send off functions to the retiring staff and faculty will be organized this year also.
- Alumnae get-together will be held on 26 January this year also, as was the practice in earlier years.
- Every month a meeting of the faculty and staff will be held to plan monitor and ensure implementation of plans and policies of the management.

44. Welfare schemes to the Faculty and Staff:

The faculty and staff of the college enjoy soft loan facility advanced by the management in case of emergencies. The procedure involves a scrutiny of the applications received by

a committee comprising the Manager, Principal and the staff Councillors. Loans granted are generally for purposes like Housing, Education and Marriage of children and above all to meet hospitalization expenses. In addition to the above, children of the members of the non-teaching staff are eligible for special scholarships instituted by the management.

PART B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

The institution has always been formulating its plans and policies in such a way as to reflect its goals and objectives. They are also designed to motivate the students to strive for the sustained national development in every possible way.

(a) Internal Quality Assurance Cell

As a post accreditation quality sustenance measure, the college has a proactive and functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell fully engaging all segments of stakeholders. The IQAC went on in full swing with its regular quality sustenance, assurance and enhancement drive for the academic year 2010-2011. During the year, the IQAC convened 14 meetings and visited the various departments twice to make a first-hand assessment of the quality of teaching, learning and evaluation processes and systems. The application for U.G.C. sponsored projects and seminars were sent to U.G.C. in July 2010,5 seminars and 7 projects were sanctioned as shown below:

Our Vice Principal Dr. Sr. Christy and Dr. R. Mangalambal were called to Delhi in the month of August, for an interface meeting with U.G.C. in connection with midterm review and evaluation of the innovative course in Cryptography. The application for new add-on courses was submitted to U.G.C. in August 2010.

The IQAC applied to U.G.C. for the award of the Centre of Potential Excellence (CPE) for the college in the month of October. The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of 2009-2010 was sent to U.G.C. in November 2010. In November, our Principal accompanied by the Senior Superintenent attended an interface meeting at the Bangalore. On 14th and 15th January, a member of the faculty and a student of I DC Maths, attended a UGC sponsored seminar on Student Participation for Quality Enhancement of Higher Educational Institutions conducted by SB College, Changanassery.

Paper presentation contest titled VOR LEGEL was held for students as part of teachinglearning quality enhancement initiative. Twelve teams participated in the contest ensuring fairly good participation. The winners were awarded trophies and certificates.

(b) Stress on National Integration

A day begins in the college with 'the thought for the day' which acts as a daily reminder to the students on the key role they play in the national life and the great goals the nation has set for them. Unity of national life undisrupted by communal or linguistic prejudices is specially dealt on in these speeches.

(c) Higher Focus Course:

As part of our effort to realize the vision and mission of the college, the existing Higher Focus course the institution had introduced years ago, went on well this year also. The course comprises a spectrum of training programmes stretching out to a period of three years. The skills imparted include driving (both two and four wheelers), personality development; spoken English, self defence (judo), Yoga etc. and they seek to empower women students in a number of ways. The students who complete the course successfully will be eligible for a Certificate.

(d) Value Based Education:

This institution understands that skills, expertise and knowledge are of no use to the citizens of a country if they are not driven by values in personal life. Therefore in this college, Value Education receives all the importance it rightly deserves. It is a systematically planned mandatory course here spreading over all the years of study of a student in the campus irrespective of the programme she has chosen and is earnestly carried out aiming at conditioning our young women for the challenges of the modern world of fast depleting values. The Catholics are imparted values on the lines of the Gospel while the non-Catholics are enlightened with other ethical discussions. We follow a structured value education syllabus prescribed by the University for degree students,

and the postgraduate students are made to debate on key eithical and moral issues under the supervision of the teachers in charge of their classes.

Along with the importance of academic excellence, this institution always places as much emphasis on value oriented ethical discussions and religion classes. Talks by eminent personalities on relevant and youth oriented topics always form part of the institution's regular sessions. Such sessions also take the form of role-plays, short films and LCD presentations for greater impact. These exercises, we believe, have helped our students a lot to come out of their shells and grow into full and complete citizens in thought and action.

The sessions on value education go on for the first two terms and at the end of each term they have to write an examination and a good performance in the examination is a mandatory condition to participate in the *Student of the Year Award*, a prestigious prize any out-going student cherishes. Honour and award also await a topper in the examination. The prizes and awards always work as motivation for the students. A responsible committee formed at the beginning of the year oversees and ensures that the value education instruction is carried out without fail to achieve its objectives.

The outreach programmes which can be considered a corollary to value education reinforce in the students the relevance of class-room instructions relating them to the realities of life. We can confidently say that part of the discipline and maturity that is well visible in our students is a direct contribution of the thrust the institution gives to the value aspect of its course content.

Apart from the above value sessions, for the benefit of the outgoing students the "Happy Home Programme', a marriage preparation course is also held every year. A fully qualified and competent doctorate counselor is at the service of the college for this purpose on full-time employment.

(e) Acquisition of Global Competence

In order to equip the students to face the challenges of the Global Job Market, adequate stress is laid on their communicative skill in English. Thrust on the spoken form of the English Language has been intensified recently by declaring the campus as entirely English Speaking. Department of English is also offering an add-on course in Communicative English. The college is trying its level best to reach 100 percent computer literacy among its staff, students and faculty. Additional coaching classes are also being held to step up the preparedness of the students to tackle successfully competitive examinations (including NET/JRF/IAS) for recruitments to various positions.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG).

In its attempt to introduce courses with utmost employment potential in the emerging and innovative areas and in conformity with the suggestions made by the NAAC Peer Team in the Re-accreditation Report, the college has commenced the following new courses:

- a) Masters in Cyber Security. This new course replaces the existing Postgraduate Diploma in Cryptography.
- b) Certificate Programs in Dance, Music, theatre and Film

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

Being an affiliated institution, this college has no independent authority to design its own curriculum and syllabus. The college is expected to follow the common curriculum and syllabus designed and implemented by the University for all the affiliated Courses. Our contribution to this area is limited to the role our teachers play as members of the various syllabus framing bodies of the University. Of course, the University programmes we offer are rendered employment oriented and industry relevant adding on to their skill development programmes. As members of the Board of examination, both PG and UG offer significant suggestions in the deliberations of the board and such suggestions invariably influence the decisions of the board in designing the curriculum. The innovative features of the curriculum the college is following:

- Maximum application of the ICT in the teaching-learning process
- Replacement of the conventional method of 'chalk and talk' by advanced Information Communication Technology gadgets like *Power Point Presentations, digital interactive boards and other Advanced Audio Video Aids.* Students themselves are encouraged to make the best use of the transactional aids like computer aided presentation techniques.
- Training in Courseware CD preparation and LCD projection for all UG and PG students.
- *Weekly Quiz Time* as a regular feature of all departments in order to focus learning to the level of minute details and to motivate the students to keep themselves abreast of the latest developments in their disciplines.
- Annual Visits by students to reputed research institutions and industrial establishments related to their area of study as an integral part of the scheme of study in addition to the mandatory internship in factories or industrial units wherever applicable.
- *Student Projects* to develop investigation faculties and writing skills
- *Exclusive programs* like Rural Camps, Mini Research, Community Oriented Programs, Article Reviews and discussions that fine-tune the students to the mind set the courses intend to develop in them
- Weekly tasks and Regular Test Papers for all undergraduate students
- *The Tutorial System*, one of the best practices followed in this institution since 1990.

The method of mentoring practised in the college can be outlined as shown below:

Students are divided into groups of 30 and entrusted to the special care of a teacher for mentoring. The mentor is always one of the teachers teaching the group of students and this ensures constant contact between the mentor and the mentored. The mentoring begins with the first meeting of the mentor and the respective group of wards for which a particular hour allotted during the first term of the year itself. This serves as the preliminary or introductory session. For handling this session fruitfully, teachers are provided with a basic counselling seminar in the first week of the month of June. Thus they are trained to identify the problems of the students and pay special attention to them.

After the preliminary session of initial rapport-building between the teacher and the student, an opportunity is given to the student to express her inner self through answering a

questionnaire. Questions asked are of personal nature and the tutor is expected to keep the answers confidential. A specimen of the questionnaire followed is furnished below:

- 1. Name, address, phone number, email etc of the student.
- 2. How to reach your home?
- 3. Achievements & talents academic and non academic.
- 4. How do you feel after coming to this institution?
- 5. One of the saddest and happiest events in your life.
- 6. A brief life history.
- 7. Support needed
 - a. Financial b. Psychological c. Spiritual d. Academic

The way the student answers the above questions varies depending on a large number of factors. Some may write all answers in detail, while some others may just write their address. That also will tell you a lot about the nature of the student.

Then the teacher has to scrutinize the answers and categorize the students as A, B and C based on the urgency of attention needed. 'A' is the group which needs immediate attention with many problems in life. Next will be a session of interaction with the student where you can make use of the written information. Those who need psychological help are directed to Darsana Counselling Centre, the full fledged professional counselling centre functioning in the college campus itself. The Centre also has a professionally qualified service of an advocate available free of cost. In case of physical ailments, service of doctors is also made available.

House Visit

Family problems affect the children more in their teenage. Many students are helpless victims of the liquor and drug addiction of the father, psychological problems of the mother and frequent quarrels at home. These children cannot concentrate on their studies in such a family atmosphere.

Tutors intervene repeatedly helping the father and the mother in such cases and try to bring about a tremendous change in the family atmosphere and finally in the children. Thus, the college provides for not only for the academic development of the student, but also for the overall welfare of the family. Financial aid is also given to the student and the family, if needed, from the P.T.A. and the Social Service Fund.

The college decided to follow the innovative practice of visiting the homes of the faculty and the students. Accordingly, the faculty visited the houses of 353 students during the year 2010-11 as detailed in the table below:

• Tutorial Record

A tutorial record is maintained by every tutor in respect of all the students under her control.

- *Remedial teaching and special academic assistance for the weak learners* include Peer Group Teaching, Special Coaching Classes before and after usual class hours in the morning and evening and consultations for which teachers are available in the campus at least an hour before the class hours and an hour after that.
- Weak learners are taken note of soon after the Post Entrance Test (PET) and their progress is constantly monitored at the tutor and department level. Students belonging to the backward and depressed classes get separate coaching classes under financial assistance from the UGC and with regard to the Harijan Welfare Department about 250 SC/ST students are attending the Remedial Coaching Classes and twenty teachers are involved in the training programme.
- Free Spoken English classes were arranged for SC/ST students with financial assistance from Kannan Devan Nature Club.
- Special Interest Programs (SIP) organized with a view to develop in the students special interest in the advanced areas, especially in students endowed with extra ordinary brilliance and aptitude, have been undertaken by the departments of Physics and Mathematics. Physics Improvement Programme (PIP) has been successful in developing sustained interest in the academically brilliant students who deserve more than the

ordinary in their intellectual pursuits. Another instance of similar programme is the SIM (Search in Mathematics) Club formed and operated by the Department of Mathematics with similar objectives.

4. Inter-Disciplinary Programmes

(a) New Academic Programme

Postgraduate Diploma in Cryptography sanctioned in 2007-08 under the Innovative Programme Scheme of the University Grants Commission has since been converted by the UGC into M.Sc. in Cyber Security, a two year Post graduate course.

(b) UGC Sponsored Add-on courses

In order to empower women with the capability to earn through self –employment, the following UGC Aided Add-on Courses have been incorporated in the regular curriculum from 2008 so that at the end of three years, the students will be equipped with a professional skill for which they will be awarded an advanced diploma along with the conventional degree in Science/Arts/Commerce. In order to ensure quality and standard, the maximum number of students in the course has been limited to 50. Admission is on first come-first served basis.

Add-on Course sanctioned by the UGC in Communicative English started functioning in the year 2009-10 under the aegis of the PG Department of English. During the academic year 2009-10, UGC sanctioned two more add -on courses, one in Gemology and the other in Yoga and Health Fitness Management . These courses commenced functioning in 2010 -11. The course in Gemology is run by the PG and Research Department of Chemistry .The Yoga and Health Management Module is managed by the Department of Physical Education.

(c) Enrichment Courses:

Apart from the above UGC aided add-on courses, the college offers the following modules overseen by Departments mentioned against each as value added career oriented self supporting components to regular UG & PG programmes:

(d) Pre- marital seminar

In the wake of the growing number of couples separating and families disintegrating, the institution has been offering since 1978, a three-day pre-marital in-campus preparatory on Post Marital Life to all outgoing students in order to prepare them for a successful family life.

5. Examination and Evaluation

During the year under review the University semesterised the UG courses, and as such the annual as well as the semester streams run simultaneously. The final year students have the annual scheme and the first and second year students follow the semester scheme.

In addition to these, they have to appear for a model examination also just before the University examinations. Other than the University examinations, monthly class tests, terminal examinations and practical examinations are the main procedures of institutional evaluation. In addition, the assignments and presentations that the students make also are evaluated for the purpose of awarding internal assessment marks. Attendance is also one of the criteria adopted for the award of internal assessment marks.

(a) Progress Cards

This institution follows the system of Progress Cards as one of its best practices. This card is a performance record of the student and is issued without fail to the

parents as a notification of the performance of their wards soon after every examination that the student takes. The cards are issued to the parents in a meeting called for the purpose. The parents are given opportunity to meet the teachers at least once in two months in this way.

The selection is made from the outgoing undergraduate students on the bases of academic achievement, popularity (Queen of Hearts), general knowledge (Miss. Brainy), personality (Star on Stage), participation in fine arts and other campus activities. The keenly contested award is one of the best practices the college has been following for long.

7. Initiatives Towards Faculty Development Programme

#### (b) Compulsory Social Service Scheme

C.S.S. activities in the college are carried out under the guidance and supervision of the Faculty Co-ordinators Dr. Sr. Christy and Ms. Vijaya E.S. At the beginning of the academic year, C.S.S. leaders were elected for each class. Periodical meetings of class teachers and C.S.S. leaders were held to give instructions regarding the planning and organizing of the C.S.S. activities of the year. Year plan consisting of a work schedule of ten days of three hours each was drawn out for all classes at the beginning of the year. October 2 was declared a Special Cleaning-day for CSS in honour of the Father of Nation. On that day, the whole student body was deployed for cleaning the class rooms and the whole campus.

The campus has been divided into various plots and allotted to various batches of students for regular upkeep and maintenance of the campus the green and the clean way. A specific time every week is assigned for this week. . The Compulsory Social Work sessions of the students also include visits to the houses of the disabled and the destitutes like Santhi Sadan, Prateeksha Bhavan, Santhwana Sadan and Providence House at Irinjalakuda. They entertain them and interact with them, and such occasions turn out to be moments of happiness and divsersion in their otherwise dull and monotonous life. Students along with their class teachers undertook out-reach trips to Asha Bhavan at Annamanada, Asha Nilayam at Kottanellur, Mercy Home at Mannuthy, Abhaya Bhavan at Porathussery, Special School under tropical health foundation at Kunnamkulam, Harmony Dementia Centre at Kottapady, Divyakarunya Ashram at Vallakkunnu, Kaipamangalam Beech and Amma at Mothirakkanny. Such trips help a lot to inculcate humanitarian values in the students. Students attended classes on discipline, cleanliness, cancer-cure, AIDS and Personality Development organized by the CSS unit during the vear.

#### (c) Community Aided Sponsorship Programme (CASP)

The activities of the CASP for the year 2010-2011 were inaugurated with the Moral School Camp in the month of May. The Camp was inaugurated by Prof. K. Chandran, Prof. (Retd.), Department of Chemistry, Christ College. About 75 children attended the camp. The five days camp was an unusual experience to the participants as it offered them a venue to exhibit their talents. The camp also had programmes that inculcated values relevant to their lives. The parents meet every second Saturday of the month to chart out the programmes. At the beginning of the academic year, books and uniforms were distributed free of cost to the deserving and the needy. Academic support programmes in the form of tuition, appraisal of academic performance and house visits were conducted during the year and a Data Bank has been prepared. Medical assistance was given to one of the CASP members under the Medical Insurance Scheme. The CASP members celebrated Onam, Children's Day and Christmas for those who could not afford such celebrations for want of money. A programme was organized for the

members on Promotive Behavioral Practices. The session was handled by Sr. Jesmin, the counselor, Darsana Counseling Center.

#### (d) AICUF

The AICUF Unit in our College stands to create a Christian atmosphere in the College Campus. On the day of the re-opening of the college, a Prayer service was organized in the college auditorium by AICUF members to infuse a spiritual ambience into the campus. A Prayer meeting was arranged in connection with the Founder's Day on June 7. The Feast of Sacred Heart of Jesus was also celebrated in a special way.

#### (f) Fine Arts Club:

The Fine Arts Club began the year's programme on 30th June 2010 with a grand welcome dance it organized for the Fresher students on the theme of Light, Life and Love, the motto of the college. Next programme of the year was the Talent Hunt, an exercise to identify talented artists from among the freshers for imparting training in various art forms. The event was on 03 August 2010 in which the freshers participanted with great vigour and spirit. They were grouped into 4 Houses to ensure keen competitition. The Fine Arts Club had its next performing day on 24 September 2010, the day on which the actitivities of the College Union was inaugurated. The Annual Fine Arts Festival with competitions in every conceivable item, off-stage as well as on-stage,began on 29 September 2010. Grouped on the basis of their class, the students participated in large numbers in the festival that went on for almost a week culminating on the Fine-Arts Day celebrated on 2 October 2010. The College day held on 10 February 2011 marked the end of the year's performances of the Fine Arts Club.

Students selected on the basis of the college-level competitions participated in large numbers in various items in the Zonal and the University level Arts Festivals of the year.

#### (g) Nature Club:

The Nature Club of the College operates with 440 students on its rolls as members. Its programme for the year included various competitions such as Flower Carpet or Pookkalam (22/09/10), Essay Writing (07/10/10), Short story-writing, Versification, Pencil drawing (21/10/10), Painting (21/10/10) etc. all on themes related to conservation and love of nature. ## **23.** Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on Student feed back

#### **Evaluation of Teaching:**

This college has an elaborate and effective system to assess teacher performance in order to give the teacher an idea of his/her strengths and weaknesses. The performance of the teacher is assessed at various stages as follows.

Assessment of the teacher by the Principal (yearly)

Assessment of the teacher by the students (yearly)

Assessment of the teacher by the peers (yearly)

Assessment of the Department by the students (yearly)

Assessment of the Department by the parents (yearly)

Self - appraisal (yearly)

At the end of each academic year each teacher of the department receives feedback from students, peers, parents and principal in the prescribed feedback format. In most cases, the concerned teacher accepts the suggestion given in the feed back for improvement. Based on this information the teacher prepares action plan for improved performance in the next

academic year. Going through this empowering process year after year, the teacher acquires perfect teacher quality.

The student also gets an opportunity to evaluate the performance of the department as a whole, again in a pre-planned feedback form. The members of the department make an open discussion about the feedback and propose the methods for the better performance in the next academic year. These student evaluations are made available to the teachers for verification in original. In these cases, however, the identity of the student is not revealed. The instrument used for the self-appraisal of the teacher is an elaborate questionnaire issued by the University and this yearly self-assessment is a prerequisite for the promotion or placement of the teacher to a higher scale or position.

#### 24. Feedback from Stake- holders

The Parents-Teachers and Well-Wishers Association (PTWA) of our college is a strong pillar of strength and support to our college. The general body meeting of the PTWA was held on 09-12-2010. A talk was arranged for the parents on the occasion as part of the parental awareness creation programme. The occasion also witnessed felicitation of the University Rank holders and International players of the year. The afternoon session was set apart for an interface of parents and teachers. The occasion was also used to collect parental feedback on the performance of the college as a whole.

The departments collected feedback from the parents on the faculty, departments and the college as a whole. The criteria for evaluation were mainly based on the quality of teaching, student- teacher relationship, and infrastructure facilities including use of ICT. Some of the suggestions came out in the evaluation were about the necessity for improving English communicative skills of the students. The stakeholders were happy with the infrastructure facilities and the exposure offered by the department.

#### 28. Technology up gradation

The management is particular that the technological resources of the college must be upgraded to keep pace with the fast growing techniques in various fields of advanced education. With this end in view the administrative machinery of the college has been automated by this time. The Library of the college is also fully computer enabled. As more and more educational data are now available on CD's, CD Library has got to be stocked with more and more Disc recordings of educational wares. The college can boast of a wide variety of the state of the art audio visual teaching aids such as Overhead Projectors, Liquid Crystal Display Units, Educational Compact Discs and Cassettes in addition to a good number of

computers. The college is also harnessing all possible means to ensure wider and longer hours of internet access to the faculty and the students at a very nominal cost.

The following figure shows the percentage of progress made by our teaching staff during the last few years in their ICT competency:



#### **30. Financial aid to students**

#### 37. Activities of the Guidance and counselling unit

#### (a) Darsana Family Counselling Centre

Wholesome individuals –Happy families - this is the motto of Darsana Family Counselling Centre, the professional Help Centre on the St. Joseph's College campus. Darsana concentrates more on Family Counselling with three fold intentions:

- Helping those already in the path of life by giving them confirmation support and training.
- Helping those who are facing problems in life by equipping them to help themselves.
- Rendering help to those in need of growth in actualizing themselves.

Darsana stands as a beacon of light in the darkness that sorrounds the society in general and family in particular fighting against the social evils like Alcoholism, AIDS, Women harassment, abortion etc and concentrating on good personality formation through counselling, awareness creation etc to individuals and groups of individuals.

Darsana made tremendous achievements during the last year. It is because of the support and co-operation from the management and dedicated service of two counselors, staff and faculty.

#### Main activities

#### 1. Counselling and referral services:-

Darsana took around 315 original cases and follow-ups during this year and also provided a number of referral services wherever necessary. The details of cases are as follows:

Twice a week we visit houses of clients. Family visits help to get a clear picture of the client's problems.

#### 3. Follow-ups

Regular follow ups provide an opportunity to measure the clients' improvement and to guide the person in future life

#### 4. Act as a liaison

According to the clients need, the centre makes arrangements for the medical and Psychiatric treatment & networking with voluntary organizations.

#### 5. Mathruvedi Meeting

In order to give awareness about their rights and duties, the centre formed a group of mothers from the nearby Shanmugham Canal Base colony. Once in a month they gather together and discuss their family problems and also the problems faced by their community and they direct clients to the centre. Darsana took initiative to start small savings schemes for the mothers, organize classes, arrange visits to various institutions and also celebrate the day of national importance.

#### 6. Awareness programme

Darsana conducted awareness programme on social evils, family relations, personality development, Gender main streaming, sex education, Motivation, Emotional management, Domestic Violence Act, Responsible parent hood, Women Empowerment, Impact of alcoholism etc. Through these seminars the participants were enlightened to lead a more meaningful life. Last year Darsana conducted 81 awareness programmes related to different topics.

#### 8. Alcoholic Anonymous Group

Two of the counselors attached to Darshana are animators of A-A Group. A.A group members and their spouses gather at the centre every Monday and share their experiences in order to sustain themselves. Days like Christmas, Onam, De-addition day etc are celebrated and they participate in competitions like sports, games and cultural items. Once in a year a picnic is arranged for the entire families of A.A group members.

#### 9. CASP

Family Counselling Centre has a group of children of the age group 10-15 residing in the nearby Canal Base Colony. They meet once in every month when seminars on different topics are provided and sports and cultural competitions are held and festivals like Onam, Christmas etc are celebrated.

#### a) House Visit

A house is built by bricks while a home is built by hearts. But when hearts are divided, homes turn out to be a regular hell. Family problems affect the children more in their teenage. Many students are helpless victims of the liquor and drug addiction of their father, psychological problems of the mother and frequent quarrels at home. We cannot expect them to perform well in academics under such circumstances. If cases of this kind is noticed by the mentor incharge of a student group in this institution he/she soon takes steps to visit the students' house, meet the parents and talk to them. Usually teachers are accompanied in such visits by the Sisters of the Holy Family Congregation who own and operate this college. Sanctifying families through house visit and prayers is the charisma of the Holy Family Sisters.

The tutor's visit to the family often produces wonderful results. The atmosphere of the family soon begins to change with the intervention of the Congregation which has the essential equipage to take care of such unfortunate families. Its Professional Counselling Centre soon springs into action and counsels the father and rehabilitates him to a healthy way of living with the help of Alcoholic Anonymous Group a unit of which operates within our campus. If he is a drug-addict, he is taken to the de-addiction centre. Medical care is given to the mother, if needed. The changed atmosphere rekindles in the student the burnt out flame of academic interest and improves in performance. It was amazing to see average students suddenly emerging as the top ones when such timely help was offered. If the student is melancholy, she is soon referred to the Counselling Centre and the care and comfort she receives there bring back on the gloomy face the smile once deserted her. From the margins she soon steps to the mainstream and win praise and accolades for her curricular and extra-curricular performances. Thus this institution provides not only the intellectual development of the student, but paves way for the

overall growth of the student as well. Financial aid is also given if needed from the P.T.A and Social Aid Fund.

Under its Faculty House visit Scheme, the faculty visited 353 Faculty Homes during the year 2010-11. It may be recalled here that the Principal, Vice Principal and the IQAC Coordinator had visited the houses of all members of the faculty and staff during the year 2010-11.

#### 43. Action Taken on the AQAR of the previous year :

- 1) It was decided by IQAC to focus more on curriculum aspects and best practices, during the year 2010-11 based on the AQAR of the previous year and accordingly, IQAC has expanded its activities, recruiting new members of the faculty and entrusting them with various responsibilities for the qualitative improvement of the college.
- 2) Many members of the faculty have been actively involved in the restructuring of the curriculum. Quite a few members of faculty have noteworthy positions in the academic bodies.
- 3) Even though the college has quite a number of good practices, a few have been selected as the best, which are the house visits to the students' homes by the teachers, the introduction of many certificate courses, which equip and enhance the ability of the students to meet the rising challenges of the society and the world at large and the conversion of the Diploma course in Cryptography to M.Sc. in Cyber Security.

The research activities of the college received a tremendous fillip during the year.

4) The activities of the Centre for research in Mathematical Science, Department of Mathematics progressed during the academic year, with the induction of research scholars for Ph.D. Four faculty (M. Phil holders) and 2 JRF (1 CSIR) students registered for PhD research under the two supervisors in the Department. Two research papers of the combined authorship of Dr. Lilly P.L. and Mr. Antony P L, and Mrs Geetha K V and Dr. Mangalambal N R got accepted for presentation in the International Congress of Mathematicians held in Hyderabad from August 19 to 28, 2010, This acceptance was a milestone in the research activity of the Department, as the International Congress held only once in four years is specially convened for the award of Fields Medal ( the Nobel equaivalent Prize in Mathematics). The 2010 version of the Congress will go down in the history of the country because it is for the first time the country is hosting the Conference. The first research scholar of the centre completed her PhD research and has submitted the thesis for evaluation.

5) The Department of Chemistry also got affiliation as research centre to the University of Calicut raising the number of research centres to two. Two more members of the faculty have been accorded research guideship.

#### c) Holy Family Hostel

The Holy Family Hostel accommodates about 250 students under the care and able guidance of the wardens – Sr. Annie James, and Sr. Asha. The serene and calm atmosphere in the hostel facilitates both intellectual growth and personality development of the students. The Hostel representatives of this academic year are Roisy Raphael of IV Semester M.A. English and Anjana Kannath of III Economics. The sports students of the hostel have won selection in the University, State, National and International teams for various events and bagged many prizes. An informative and thought provoking talk was given to the hostelites by Prof. K.L. Francis, Lecturer, St. Thomas College, Thrissur.

#### Sports Hostel Students

The college hosel accommodates 40 sports students of whom 18 students stay at the cost of Government Sports Council (Volleyball). The college enjoys sports council (Volleyball) assistance for 9 college students and 9 school students). Twenty-two sports students of various sports forms like Volleyball, Ball badminton, Football, Judo, Tennis, Kho-Kho, Hand ball, etc. are accommodated in the hostel. Among these 22 students, 14 students were free hostelers funded by management and the students belong to the reservation category enjoying aid from the government.

#### d) Redress Cell

The students often offer suggestions on the changes they expect in the working of the college, department etc. and these suggestions are invariably taken into account and attempts are made to implement them. During the year, the following feedback suggestions came up from among the students and appropriate actions were taken to implement them:

The Grievance Redress Cell consists of the following members: The Principal, Vice Principal, the Superintendent, a staff representative and the IQAC Coordinator. The Cell received the following grievances during the year:

- Harassment in bus and misbehaviour outside the campus were the main complaints.
- 4 Additional facilities for drinking water was another request.

The Cell considered these grievances in detail and found them genuine

- Timely action was taken by informing the police in the case of the first case. Arrangements have also been made for surprise police patrolling.
- A water purifier was installed on the first floor out of the funds raised by the colleg Union.

#### e) Central Monitoring Cell (Student Support Services)

Central Monitoring Cell functioning under the direct charge of the Vice Principal always remains ready to look into the student needs, requests or grievances and they receive immediate attention when raised. During the year, the Cell took up several problems related to Examinations with the office of the Controller of Examinations.

Students were also given timely information and guidance regarding scholarship instituted by the Govt. and other agencies such as Single Girl Child scholarship, Minority Scholarship, Muslim Scholarship, Manorama Merit Scholarship, Suvarna Jubilee Scholarship for BPL students, Scholarship to children of Beedi workers, University Merit Scholarship, Central sector scheme scholarship, post Merit Scholarship, Sitaram Jindal Foundation Scholarship and Blind PH Educational Scholarship.

It is a matter of gratification that single girl children were able to get a scholarship of Rs.40,000/- each., Children of Beedi workers were able to get scholarships of Rs.3,000/- each. Kerala State Suvarna Jubilee Scholarship of Rs.10,000/- each for BPL students were awarded to 7 students, Post merit Scholarship of Rs.1850/- each were awarded to 26 students. Minority Scholarships of Rs.3,000/-, Blind PH Educational Scholarship of Rs.4,000/-, Central sector Scholarship of Rs.10,000/- University Merit Scholarship of Rs.1800/- and Sitaram Jindal Foundation Scholarship of Rs.3,000/- were also granted.

Website details, photocopies of applications etc. were provided by the cell to the students. The filled in applications were sent to the agencies concerned from the college.

A Jagratha Samithi and Ethics Committee were constituted in the college as per Government orders, under the direct charge of the Principal to deal with cases of harassment of students inside and outside the campus. Presentation of Cinematic dance and use of mobile phones with camera, are strictly forbidden in the campus.

The IQAC was entrusted with the responsibility of submitting a proposal for UGC's Centre of Potential Excellence and the proposal was submitted to the UGC in time. The outcome is awaited.

In order to ensure active and positive student participation in the activities of the IQAC, a student was selected and sent to attend the Seminar on the area in SB College, Changanacherry and the result is encouraging.

The paper presentation competition sponsored by the IQAC in order to initiate the students to the new approach of self-learning also was attended by large number of students. It has paved way to more and more students writing paper for presentation as a method of self learning.

#### 2. Higher Focus Course

The ongoing Higher Focus Course intended to mould a self reliant and multi-skilled women community was modified to suit the times. The course will henceforth have a component on women rights and clothing as confidence boosting measures. The modification was widely accepted by the campus community and is expected to yield rich dividends.

#### 3. Value Based Education

The values instilled in the students through the regular sessions on value education have made the students to a great extent generous, understanding, humane and considerate. The outreach programmes like 'fast and feed' the liberal help in cash and kind extended by them to the poor and the needy and the enthusiasm with which they participate in activities of common good and philanthropy, all show that they are sufficiently humanized . A detailed account of such activities can be found in Part B of this report.

#### 4. Acquisition of Global Competence

The multiple soft skills like Communicative English, Computer proficiency, interview techniques, emotional competence and team work skills, etiquettes, Entrepreneurial skills etc. have enhanced the employability potential of the students during the last few years. The Human Resource Development Cell and the Student support Cell also help them a lot in equipping themselves with essential timely skills that will enable them to land in a job opportunity.

#### **5.** New Academic Programmes

M.Sc Cyber Security (Innovative Course sanctioned by the UGC) started functioning in the college from the year 2009-10 and still continues. A few innovative courses for which we have requested to the University are yet to be sanctioned.

#### 6. Innovations in curriculum design and transaction:

We could make most of our conventional programmes job-oriented offering along with them add-on courses that are totally industry relevant. Our teachers have enthusiastically participated in the University deliberations concerning the revision of syllabus and they had a role in whatever revision the University has implemented in the syllabi of the various programmes during the recent years. The details of the positions our teachers hold in University bodies may please be found in Part B of this report.

#### 7. Innovative features of our curriculum

It is primarily in teaching and learning that we have introduced the innovative technology. Teachers and students were trained in the use of ICT enabled teaching aids and they are now extensively using these aids in teaching and learning process. The number of the presentations made by the teachers and students has gone up during the year and the students are made to present as many topics as possible in the class rooms. The ultimate result is that

they have become very much familiar with the technology related to teaching and learning. Every department has been provided with an LCD and other necessary accessories and this has enabled the faculty to effectively replace blackboards and crayons in the class-room with a more powerful teaching aid. Other advanced teaching aids too are being procured and put to use in the classrooms and one such accessory that is going to be introduced very soon is the interactive board. The table given below shows the increase in the number of digital presentations made by the students:

Following the introduction of Quiz as a mode of teaching and learning, departments have made it a weekly programme and this has led to the students focusing on even the minute details of the subject content. The mode also drives the students to the frontier areas of their subjects in search of latest developments. Students' response to this mode too has been quite enthusiastic. Quiz as a teaching mode has been in use in the college for the last few years. It has been proved successful especially in frequent testing and evaluation of the topics taught. Now almost all departments here have adopted it as a practice and the result has been amazing. The students too have found the method quite agreeable.

Thrust on text-book learning has been minimized taking the students more and more to the sites where their learning is put to use. They make frequent trips to research organizations, factories and technical establishments. The system has helped them relate what they have learned in books to practical application reinforcing their grasp of the subject. Internship too has been made a part of the program wherever required.

Use of ICT has been extended to examinations too. Almost all entrance examinations conducted by the college are now online, especially the Cyber Security Admission Test. (CSAT).

Activity oriented teaching and learning process also is being extensively practised as a new mode of teaching. This has also been found quite satisfactory. Exclusive programs like rural camps, mini research, community focused work, article reviews and discussions have helped to fine-tune the students to the mindset the course (MSW) intends to develop in them.

Weekly test paper system which is a regular feature here has served the students as a timely preparation for the semester-end examinations. This has indeed improved the final results of the various programmes.

The Tutorial System/the mentoring system, one of the best practices the institution has been following successfully since the 1990s, is widely appreciated by the parents and the students alike for its effectiveness as a tool to give the students a sense of security and support in the campus. The alienation most of the students feel when first brought to the campus as a first year degree student is taken care of by the teacher mentoring her they start feeling at home. This was the kind of feedback we used to get from the students after the system was introduced. The feeling that they have someone to take care of them in the campus is quite reassuring and keeps them at ease and comfort in the campus throughout the course. In the case of need, students are offered financial assistance in addition to psychological, spiritual or academic guidance. During the year under review, the departments disbursed to students financial assistance for various purposes as shown below:

The Peer Group Teaching, another innovative approach to the teaching-learning process, also has produced very encouraging results. The influence of the peer group on the weak learners was tremendous. The socially backward students were paid special attention and this also has resulted favorably in the examination results of this group of students.

House visit faculty pay to the students' homes is another best practice the institution has been following for the last several years. This practice also has yielded commendable results. The intimacy that the faculty has been able to develop with the students and their homes has helped the students to open up their miseries and personal problems to the faculty and this has enabled the faculty to interfere at the opportune moment and suggest suitable remedies to alleviate the students problems. This is also very widely appreciated by the stakeholder community. The faculty visited 253 student homes during the last year.

Equally result producing was the remedial coaching which was carried out with the support of twenty teachers. Special Interest Programme of the Mathematics Department and Physics Improvement Programme of the Physics Department too were really encouraging programmes for the concerned students. They are also innovative schemes done with the special objective of identifying students with genuine interest in the concerned subject.

Pre-marital seminar that every student is expected to attend at the end of the course also is a good practice followed by the college. The seminar is a form of three-day mass counseling for a successful married life.

#### 8. Interdisciplinary Innovative Programmes

The college has been sanctioned M.Sc in Cyber Security as an innovative programme by the UGC. The programme is successfully functioning with adequate number of student-strength. The first batch of students will complete their course by 2012.

#### 9. Vocationalization of the Conventional Degree Courses:

Our attempts to vocationalize conventional degree course drove us for job oriented add-on courses and we applied for UGC financial assistance for the commencement of these courses.

During the XI Five Year Plan, the UGC sanctioned financial assistance for three of our requests the details of which are shown below:

The Courses are being run successfully and the students undergoing the first and the third course have enhanced their employability chances.

In addition to the above, about eighteen self-supporting certificate courses are being offered by the departments to enhance employability potential of the students. The courses are so designed as to suit the aptitude and taste of the students so that they can choose the course as they like. These courses too are taken by the students with all the seriousness they deserve.

#### **10. Examination and Evaluation:**

The changes brought about by the Semesterization of the programmes by the University have necessitated a few changes in the existing examination and evaluation pattern. Twenty percent of the total marks of all classes now is awarded based on internal assessment with very clear appropriation criteria like assignment, seminar, test-paper and attendance. The mid-semester examination serves the students as a model for the end-semester examination. The system of Progress card is an effective method of informing the parents, the second group of stake-holders, about the performance and progress of the students. This is a practice that has been going on successfully ever since the inception of the college. Since the cards are handed over to the parents directly in a meeting called for the purpose, this serves as an opportunity for the parents to meet the teachers in person and discuss the progress of their wards.

The Student of the Year Award given to the best outgoing undergraduate student every year is another way of motivating them for higher achievements and this has produced the desired effect. Today, this is the most coveted position for which the UG students struggle during all the three years of their course.

#### **11. JRF/NET/SLET Examinations:**

All PG Departments of the institution have arrangements for coaching their PG students for the national level competitive examinations like JRF/NET/SLET etc. During the year under review five of them got through the NET examination.

#### **12. Research Development Initiatives**

As suggested by the NAAC, on the initiative of its research organ *GRACE*, the institution made a commendable leap in research-related activities this year.

- a) GRACE (Guidance for Research and Consultancy Enhancement): GRACE brings out every year a compendium of the research papers produced independently by the faculty. The publication, RAYS, has taken the form of an interdisciplinary journal of national standards by this time. The last of its editions came out on 29 March 2011 with thirteen papers by the faculty members of various departments.
- b) Research Centres: Now the college has two Research Centres one in Mathematics and the other in Chemistry. The Department of Mathematics has by this time produced a PhD and has ten research scholars working for their PhD. The Chemistry Centre of research which obtained sanction recently is yet to start work.
- c) Teacher Fellowships: The research supportive atmosphere existing in the college had its impact on the teachers and seven of them availed of the Teacher Fellowship facility of the UGC for pursuing research leading to PhD during this year.
- d) Research Projects: UGC has sanctioned sixteen minor projects with a total outlay of Rs. 14, 70, 500 to the members of the teaching staff. The status of the projects are as follows:

The Department of Mathematics of the college received Seminar Grants to the tune of Rs. 1,50,000 jointly from Indian Academy of Sciences, Bangalore, Indian National Science Academy New Delhi and National Academy of Sciences - India, Allahabad and Indian Trade foundation. Department of Commerce also received a Rs. 1, 50,000 grant from the Indian Trade Foundation and MCR Group of Companies for a three day seminar in study skills and related areas.

Other Financial Assistance: Department of Science & Technology has sanctioned under FIST (Funds for Improvement of Science & Technology Infrastructure in Higher Education Institution) an amount of Rs. 30 lacs to the PG and Research Department of

Chemistry for the purchase of sophisticated laboratory equipment during the year under review.

*e)* Faculty Participation in Seminars: Faculty participation in Seminars of various levels was another highlight of the year's research activity. The following table shows the number of papers they presented in various seminars :

 Industry-institution interface: Our attempts for a broader institution-industry interface have resulted in collaboration with a number of local industrial units and commercial establishments. Three of them are based on MoU for training for which we have no facilities or faculty here. Two of them are for joint activities and three for project provision.

#### **13. Internal Resource Generation**

During the year under review, the college generated internal resources worth almost a crore of rupees and the amount includes fees from self-supporting courses, management contribution, advertisement charges, college development fund, donations and PTWA fund.

**14. The Community services** programmes are carried out through three organs in the college. The college has optional National Service Scheme and the Compulsory Social Service Scheme and the National Cadet Corps, all aimed at promoting social service projects. During the year the activities of these organs went on well with 21 endeavors of cleaning, greening, planting campaigning and blood donation. The programmes have developed in them a sense of belonging to the community and an understanding of the problems that plague the society. The students have to undertake thirty hours of mandatory social work every year as laid down by the University rules and no one is exempted from it. Two hundred volunteers of optional service are also serving in the college. They have to attend compulsory seven day camp after which they are issued a certificate by the university. The camp is meant for generating among the students the joy of living together and working on a bigger project of social need and necessity. The intended objective is thus realized by both modes of the programme.

**Blood Donors' Forum:** This forum working under the guidance of the Zoology Department undertakes the responsibility of identifying blood groups and maintains a directory of the various groups of blood available in the college. Any one in need of blood can get in touch with the Forum for their requirement and they will get due direction from the forum as to whom to contact for the type of blood they need.

*CASP:* This is a community aided sponsorship programme which reaches out the poor and the needy children with academic support, free supply of school uniforms and books, medical assistance and behavioral corrections. The beneficiaries are also given lessons on values and talents. At present, seventy five children of 5-17 age groups are receiving support from CASP.

**AICUF:** The Federation strives to inculcate Christian values and morals in the students through regular work in the campus in the form of prayer meetings, retreats, seminars, camps and team activities. Charity and compassion to the fellow beings and the suffering are the keynotes of most of the organizational campaigns.

*National Cadet Corps:* The unit of the NCC working in the college also aims at humanitarian endeavors like blood donation, reaching out to the poor and the needy and support for the deprived. Fifty five cadets found their way into the CAWATC during Onam and Christmas vacations.

*Fine Arts Club*: Fine Arts Club produced enviable results during the year. The Talent Hunt, a regular yearly feature hunted out the really talented among the freshers (I Degree students) in order to be trained in the respective art forms they are gifted. The college has a permanent arrangement for training such students during the after-college hours. A good number of them also found their way to the University zonal and inter-zone competitions.

*Nature Club*: With a four hundred following, the Nature Club links the present day industry and commerce oriented student community of the machine age to the nature from which they are now alienated to a great degree. The activities of the club for the year were inspiring. A number of nature related competitions, seminars and talks made them aware of the need to get connected to nature again. Nature Club brought out its annual manuscript magazine *Haritha* this year also. The club also made a timely contribution of Rs. 1500 towards CASP, the community aided sponsoring program.

*Entrepreneurial Development Club*: Organized and managed by the Department of Economics, the club undertook during the year a number of programmes like career guidance, seminars, industrial visits etc. in order to instill in the students confidence to venture into entrepreneurship. The programmes produced some result in that some of the students are seriously thinking of opening up their own enterprises in Beauty and Garment sectors.

*Film Club*: The film club operating in the campus organized a one-day film festival of classic films – *Impressions* - in the campus in order to highlight the art value of films. The programme informed the students about the need to distinguish between the commercial and art films, and to view films as works of art.

*Women Development Cell:* The highlights of the year's programme was "fast a meal, feast a meal" which was intended to feed the poor undergoing treatment in the Government hospital. A student programme, it involved considerable sacrifice on their part because the meal they took to the hospital was the one they spared by fasting. A number of BPL patients benefited by the scheme. The Cell also joined hands with Alpha Pain Clinic in their palliative endeavors. The students who participated in the quiz contest conducted by the women cell of the nearby college bagged the second place.

*Student Association for Computer Science (SACS):* The association arranged sessions on interview techniques, quiz contest and seminar on XML Technology. On IT day, a Seminar on Careers in Computers and an IT Exhibition were organized. Inter school and Intercollegiate quizzes were held. Dr. K.T. Arasu's (Wright State University) talk on Perfect Sequence Construction was another important event of the year.

*Malayalam Club*: Through its various activities, the Malayalam club also tried to propagate the heritage of the Malayalee culture and the importance of its literature. Floklore is one of the areas in which the club concentrates. The various programmes of the club reinforced in the minds of the students the cultural heritage of the state. The Club collaborated with the Janamaithri Unit of the local police in celebrating the year's Christmas which included the extension of the festivities to the various orphanages in the Municipality area. The attempt also underscored communal harmony and Christian charity.

*Staff-Teaching and Non-teaching*: Owing to certain governmental policies, half of the teaching staff in the college is guest faculty. This is almost true in the case of non-teaching staff too. Out of the 42 permanent teachers 32 are Associate Professors and 10 Assistant Professors. Fifty percent of the permanent teachers are PhD degree holders and six of them are approved research guides of various universities.

Unit cost of education: Cost of education per student is Rs. 7,701 in the case of aided wing and Rs. 11,428 in the case of self financing wing.

*Library*: The College library has 56,525 volumes of books, 330 journals/periodicals, 1,000 CD ROMs and 12 open for all internet terminals. During the year under review 2,091 volumes were added to the stock of books. Thirty four new journals have also been added to the existing collection.

*Evaluation of Teaching*: The elaborate system of feedback now in place in the college enables effective self- assessment in the case of teachers, and this has helped them to correct themselves and improve their performance to a great degree. As the system permits

appraisal of the teacher quality at six different stages, it was never arbitrary too. It is sufficiently confidential too and therefore never turned out to be a method of insult to the teacher. In the system, the teacher is bound to face screening even by the University in the system as it implies that the self appraisal submitted by the teacher is often verified and taken to account when a teacher is promoted to a higher rank.

*Stake-holder Feedback*: This is one of the most important documents as it comes mainly from the parents of the students. It is a mature judgment of the teacher concerned and is therefore more reliable than the feedback received from the student. The feedback is not limited to the teacher quality alone; it also evaluates the infrastructure, facilities and the programmes offered by the college and also suggestions for improvement.

*Unit cost of Education*: The cost incurred by the college for imparting instruction to each student is very high. In the aided sector it is Rs. 12, 240 which shows that the facilities offered to the students are of a high quality and accessibility. For self-supporting courses, the figure is about Rs. 17, 813. This is also demonstrative of the fact that the self-supporting courses do not tend to be a money making strategy of the management. Virtually there is very little gap between what is obtained from them as fee and what is spent on them for facilities offered.

*ICT enabled administrative set-up*: Almost all aspects of administration like, the processes of admission, examination and some screening tests are fully computerized so that they are highly transparent. The finance section too is entirely digitalized in order to ensure accuracy and speed. The automated atmosphere in the office has also sped up almost all issue and receipt functions. Not even a single desk in the office is without a system that is properly cared for.

*Technology Up-gradation:* The management has taken special care to ensure that state of the art technology is made use of in the delivery of services to its stakeholders. During the year under review, technology up-gradation and updation cost the college an amount of Rs.7,30,500 And this was primarily under the heads of Structures, equipment, ICT and digital courseware. The focus now is on converting the campus into wi-fi with adequate safeguard against abuse. The immediate result of technology upgradation is visible in the campus in the following:

- 1) Enrichment Module course in Latex Software for M.Sc students
- 2) Certificate course in operations research
- 3) MS Project, SPSS, Key-Plot and other advanced soft-wares in Social Sciences
- 4) E-learning process

*Computer Skill up-gradation training for Staff and Faculty:* The college has a permanent arrangement by which the staff and the faculty get updated in their computer skills every year so that they are never out of date in their computer skills. Every year the college opens after the mid-summer vacation with a fifteen-day-session devoted to ICT skill upgrdation for the faculty and the staff. The ICT literacy rate of the campus is hundred percent at present.

**Departmental Financial Aid to Students:** Students of inadequate means are offered financial support by the Department when they find that a student fails to participate in academic or non- academic activities for want of money. No student in the campus is allowed to forgo any of the course requirement and co-curricular need for want of funds. The Departments raise funds for this purpose by various means. During the year under review the total amount spent by the Departments on this funding alone is Rs. 9, 46, 090. This concern and compassion that the campus offers keep the beneficiaries ever bound to the campus. Even after decades the help extended to them under the scheme keep reverberating.

The Alumni Association and its Support: The College has a pride place in the hearts and minds of the students who have taken leave of the college after their courses. They are

spread far and wide home and abroad. In almost all places in the Gulf and in some parts of America and Europe St. Joseph's Alumni units are operating successfully. They assemble at least once in a year in the campus as home-coming. The college publishes a News-letter for them every year. Their support to the college is also commendable. They have by this time instituted two scholarships for the students. This is sufficient proof to show the strong link between the college and its students.

**Parent-Teachers Association:** PTA has always remained a tower of strength for the college. It has always come to us with help at hours of need. It has also effectively taken part in the development activities of the college without hesitation. #### **15. Health Centre support to students:**

The records at the centre show that an average of ten to fifteen patients receives medical attention at the centre every day.

#### 16. Sports & Games

The year's operations of the full- fledged Physical Education Department of the college were not limited to the campus alone this year. It hosted eight national and state level events in various items of sports during the year. It was also the venue for three coaching camps in Badminton, Volleyball and Shuttle Badminton. The college retained its University title in volley ball for the 29th year in succession. A cash incentive of Rs. 2,000 was paid to Ms Neethu Haridas of II B.Com in recognition of her participation in the Asian Volleyball Tournament in Malayesia. The college also had the international triumph this year with the gold medal Miss P C Thulasi won in the International Open Shuttle Badminton Tournament held at Bombay. The college has also three international

participations during the year. It had four national participations and won one national first and two national fourth places. Among the inter-university successes, the college has nine silver triumphs and thirteen participations. It also has a fourth place in one of the South Zone Meets. The State level gold successes are four this year for the college, silvers two and the third places four. One fourth place and five participations round off the state level results.

#### 21. Development programmes for non-teaching staff:

Like the Teaching Staff, the non-teaching staff also attended a number of programmes to enhance their skills which included courses, seminars and workshops conducted by the Management and external agencies. A Mutual Aid Fund is also operating in the college to assist the NTS in their financial difficulties.

#### 22. Good Practices and their impact on the enhancement of quality

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell operates as an enhancement and sustaining mechanism of quality in every aspect of its functioning. The Cell is singularly responsible for all the improvements made by the institution under all the NAAC criteria.

The College website keeps the functioning of the college quite transparent. Every detail of its working is put up on the website for the public to see, evaluate and appreciate.

Thrust on Value Education: Value Education is a part of the curriculum in this institution and it is pursued as one of the serious subjects of study. Students are imparted lessons in value education as per a prefixed time-table. Students are made to write regular examinations and based on the scores made by the students proficiency prizes are awarded to them. This keeps the students motivated. The effort is worthwhile because today the society is ailing much for want of morals and values. The focus on value education has salvaged the students here from ethical bankruptcy.

Pre-planned Academic Calendar and Examination Schedule: The academic calendar keeps the students informed of the schedule of teaching and learning pretty early and this helps them come prepared to the college with adequate background information on the topics to be discussed. The examination schedule is also given early so that they can anticipate the examination and remain prepared. Sudden examination without prior information shatters the confidence of the students and the evaluation made on the basis of such examination will never be accurate and correct.

Transparent Internal Evaluation System: Since the internal evaluation mechanism in place in the college is adequately transparent and trustworthy, students view it seriously and work well to do their best. Such a system keeps their morale always high. Complaints about the internal tests are hardly heard and this itself is sufficient proof to indicate that the internal evaluation system is faultless.

ICT Enabled and learning-centered teaching-learning process: The teaching-learning process has undergone drastic changes in the colleges during the last few years and ICT has been put to use in a large measure in the process. Almost all digital teaching aids are now available in the college. Teachers are also well trained to utilize it as situation demands. LCD systems are put to use in every classroom as a teaching aid and digital courseware of the most sophisticated kind have also been procured for use in the class rooms. Industrial visits/study tours: This also forms part of the teaching-learning process here. Students of all UG programmes undertake study tours or industrial visits as the case may be depending on the nature of the subjects they have opted. Usually the trip is undertaken during the last year of the course. PG students are also expected to undertake such trips if the

curriculum insists. In the case of certain progammes like M.Sc (Cyber Security), it is mandatory that they spend some days in the industry to learn the tricks of the trade.

Endowment Talks: Endowment talks also form part of the campus experience here. A number of yearly endowments have been instituted in all disciplines and the talks, often confined to a pre-determined area, are delivered by top-notch academicians in the area.

Home visits: It is usual here for the faculty to pay visits to the homes of the students in order to have a closer look at the circumstances that have moulded them. Such visits also help in developing a bond of intimacy between the students and the teacher which is very essential for the students to open up their problems to the teacher or mentor. Members of the faculty also visit the homes of their colleagues which is helpful to cement camaraderie among the faculty.

Green & Clean Campus: The College pays much attention to keep the campus green and clean. The college has specially appointed staff for this purpose. It also makes use of the services of the National Service Scheme Volunteers and the Compulsory Social Service Scheme volunteers to keep the campus clean and green. The college co-operates with almost every endeavor of the outside agencies like the local self government and the Government Forest Department in its cleaning and greening drive.

Awards and Prizes: To provide motivation to the staff and the students in their respective functions, a number of awards and prizes have been instituted by the college. Student of the Year Award, Youth Icon Award, Proficiency Prizes etc. are a few of them. The Teacher of the Year Award and Researcher of the Year Award are awards instituted by the Management as encouragement to teachers and researchers.

The college observes befittingly all the national festivals and international days of importance without fail. Every department is entrusted with the responsibility of observing one or the other Day of Importance, preferably the one that has some relevance to the subject of the Department.

Another worth-mentioning achievement of the college is the establishment of a Research Promotion Cell (GRACE) and the publication of an Annual Research Journal (RAYS). GRACE has been able to create and maintain a research ambiance on the campus and thanks to its effort the faculty and the students have been motivated to undertake a number of research ventures. Total number of faculty publications also found an increase owing to the efforts of GRACE.

Human Resource Development and Placement Department: This department has been working in three directions.

- 1. Guiding students in their career choice.
- 2. Preparing them with soft skills to be industry ready
- 3. Finding out employment for them in the industry

The Department conducts preparatory classes for national competitive examinations like JRF-NET of the UGC, Civil Service and Bank Officers selection. Two of our departments viz., Journalism and Mass Communication and Social Work have cent percent placement record.

#### 23. Professional In-campus Counseling Centre

Present day tense academic atmosphere has created a lot of psychological problems for the students and most of them are so tense that they cannot go without professional counseling help. It is to provide them this help that the college has arranged for in-campus professional counseling services. Several students receive help from this centre.

#### **24. Departmental Publications:**

Every department in the college brings out a publication of its own. This provides enough opportunities for the students and faculty to express themselves. All publications are not subject oriented. However, as far as possible, departments bring out publications related to their subjects. Following are the important publications brought out by the department during the last year:

#### **25. Departmental Association**

Every department has an Association of which the students of that department are members. The Association functions as a body that promotes the interest of the students in that subject, and for that purpose, the association organizes various programmes like Seminars, discussions, quizzes etc. All the associations worked in this direction to an excellent extent this year and the students participated in these functions enthusiastically.

#### 26. Academic Excellence Committee:

The Committee works as a body meant to promote the quality of the academic standards of the students in various ways. It organizes programmes to sustain the interest of the students in academic pursuits and motives them to do better. The committee organized a number of classes in the advanced areas of Mathematics for the benefit of the top-class students of that department. Similar efforts have also been done in the case of Physics students. But the most admirable programme that the Committee organizes is the *Student of the Year Contest* which is a series of grueling tests to bring out the best in the contestants.

#### 27. Wall Magazines

Every department has its own Wall Magazine which showcases the current and the relevant in the subject concerned. The attempt here is to bring to the attention of the student-passer-by ideas or messages in a glance. The medium functioned with great success throughout the year. Every year the best of these Wall Magazines is chosen and a prize awarded.

#### 28. Tutorial /Mentoring

This institution views tutorial/mentoring with great importance. Every teacher is entrusted with the mentorship of thirty students and elaborate documentation of the tutorial work done by them in respect of their wards is maintained by the mentors. The practice has generated very intimate relations between the teacher and the students so that the students feel like opening up her problems to the teachers without hesitation. The method has been highly successful and has gone a long way in fostering confidence and moral courage in many of the students.

It is particularly during the first few days of the student in the college that the system proves to be a boon. These are days when the students feel a bit insecure because of the unfamiliar atmosphere into which they are introduced. The system also has helped us eradicate ragging from the campus. This is, we are happy to state, is a campus of zero-ragging incident.

Peer-Mentoring: We also have in the campus Peer mentoring system by which every senior student is entrusted with the responsibility of taking care of six junior students and this system is a total guarantee to the fresher against ragging.

#### 29. Inter-collegiate Quiz Contests:

A good number of inter-collegiate quizzes are organized by various departments in their respective areas to keep the students abreast of the latest developments in the subject concerned. The quizes familiarize them with the frontier areas and generate in them interest to probe deeper and deeper into the subject. #### **31.** Accolades for Achievers

The college has always been in the forefront in motivating cream strata of the students lest they should get discouraged. This is achieved by the institution through a number of prizes, awards, scholarships instituted for this purpose. The college has at present seventy five such accolades meant for academically brilliant students alone. These awards are distributed every year without fail and the names of the winners go into the roll of honour of the college. Excellence in performance is acknowledged not only at the college level but also at the university level. All rank holders belonging to the college are suitably felicitated by the college community, parent teachers association and the concerned departments and these occasions pass onto their life history as an unforgettable moment.

#### 32. Student Support System

The college has in place an unfailing student support system. Any student can get in touch with the cell formed for this purpose and the cell comes out with suitable aid. The kind of support offered range from a personal need of the student for obtaining a paper from the University to a financial aid that she needs for some important purpose. The feeling the support system provides is one of security and concern and the student feels more at home in the campus than perhaps she is at her own home. The Cell takes care to bring to the attention of the students all sorts of scholarships available to them from the government or other agencies and helps them through, right from the preparation of the proposal down to the last stage of receiving payment. And all these services are offered to them free of cost.

#### 33. Community Aid Training Programme

Under this programme school children who are needy and helpless are provided educational support by way of financial assistance and books, tuition etc.

#### 34. Higher Focus Course

This is a special programme that the college has designed for the holistic development of the student and includes a composite training programme starting from vehicle driving to the philosophies of moral values and self defense. The programme is spread over a period of

three years and is introduced at the beginning of the degree course so that the students can complete training in all the components by the end of their degree course. The intent is to mould them as pro-active self reliant complete citizens fully developed to meet the needs of the nation and the society. The course has been going on for the last ten years and has proved to be of exceptional use to the students.

#### **35. House Visits**

Family problems adversely affect the students' performance and scheme of life. Many students are helpless victims of their vicious domestic atmosphere and a drunken father or a mentally deranged mother can shatter all their hopes and aspirations. Quarrels become quite common in such homes and it becomes impossible for the students to concentrate on their studies in such an atmosphere. In such instances, tutors can work miracles changing the entire situation for the student by his/her intervention. Our tutors do visit such student homes and persuade the father to change his ways. If he is an addict to intoxicants he is shown to a de-addiction centre. If it is the mother who needs attention, she is taken to the hospital. Once problems of these sorts are set right, we have found the students improving wonderfully in their studies and other co-curricular activities. The money needed in these cases is provided by the PTA fund or the Social Service Fund. The members of the faculty visited 222 student-homes during the last year and the Principal, Vice-principal and the IQAC Co-ordinator visited the homes of the entire faculty. The practice has knit the entire staff and student community into a close community with the common aim of promoting the interests of the institution.

#### 36. Enrichment courses

The college has provided for a number of Enrichment Courses that would complement the degree courses with some vocational content. As the college cannot revise the syllabus of the courses according to the industry needs we thought of complementing them with such self-supporting components, and the practice has produced the desired effect. The courses provided by each department equip the student with some skill related to the area of their study and the skills chosen are those that they can put to use readily.

#### 37. Linkages:

The institution has developed academic linkages with several institutions which include research and academic institutions, industrial and commercial units, Non-governmental agencies, government departments and bodies, hospitals and medical centres, banks and cultural bodies. These linkages have enabled the institution to provide the students necessary internship training, industrial acquaintances, research guidance, on-the-spot study facilities, reference sources and project help. The linkages also threw open to the students of various disciplines opportunities for application skills otherwise unavailable to them.

#### 38. Action Taken on the AQAR of the Previous Year:

The focus of the last year's activities was on the learning and teaching process, especially on the introduction of ICT enabled devices as teaching tools. As such, attempts were made to familiarize the teachers and the students with the latest developments in this area. The college also procured equipment needed for the purpose. The library also received adequate attention and the number of digital courseware went up.

The syllabus was made industry oriented tagging on to it various components that would enhance the employment or self-employment potential. Not even a single degree programme offered by the college is without an add-on component. Another significant change in the programames offered was the conversion of the Diploma Course in Cryptography sponsored by the UGC as an innovative programme into a two-year postgraduate degree course with its innovative status retained.

Research activities in the college also received a fillip. The research centre in Mathematics produced its first PhD and both the Guides in the department have five research students each pursuing PhD and this is the maximum strength sanctioned by the University. The number of National and International Conferences hosted and attended by the faculty also went up. Two members of the Mathematics faculty had the distinction of presenting a paper in the International Mathematical Congress held at Hyderabad. The college was sanctioned a research centre in Chemistry this year with two research supervisors. The year also saw two members of the Commerce faculty recognized approved guides by the Mahatma Gandhi University. There was also a significant rise in the number of papers produced and presented by the faculty this year.

Consultancy Services also found a rise during the year. Various departments offered free consultancy services to the teachers of Higher Secondary, Secondary and other educational institutions during the year in the following areas:

Bio-crystallization, Biomaterials, Photoconductivity studies, Thin films, Research process and projects, technical writing, consumer electronics, e-learning devices, entertainment electronics, maintenance of electrical equipment, secondary and higher secondary science projects, Science and technological exhibitions, quiz contests and competitive examinations in Physics, Blood Group detection, B. Ed projects, PG Project guidance in History and Botany, Water quality analysis, Spectra photometer readings, Antimicrobial activity, Taxation, PhD and MBA projects, Language assistance for reports, dissertations etc.

Department of Biotechnology generated an amount of Rs. 3,105 by way of consultancy fee during the year under review.
