# **ANNUAL REPORT OF THE INSTITUTION 2020-2021**

#### **CRITERIA WISE REPORT**

The academic year of 2020-2021 was an year of turbulence as the nation was under the pressures of the unexpected Covid-19 pandemic. The lockdown and online mode of education were new to the institution and its members but it was highly appreciable that the disadvantages of being in a constricted mode were utilized efficiently for upgrading the infrastructural developments of the college building. The online possibilities opened a new era of diverse educational experience that provided the faculty and students with the fortunate opportunity of academic interaction with people from any location of the world. On the whole, the college faced numerous obstacles in implementing its academic endeavours but through dedicated efforts, the college has been able to perform exceptionally well in almost all the criterions.

#### CRITERIA 1

There are four major aspects in criteria 1 namely: curricular planning and implementation, academic flexibility, curricular enrichment and feedback mechanism of the college. The following gives a brief summary of these sub-categories:

- Curricular aspects: The college has dived deep into curricular planning and implementation by diverting its attention in developing the CO, PSO and PO of the course programs offered by the institution. The curriculum follows the choice-based credit system and is developed based on the yearly feedback received from its stakeholders. The college has been punctual in updating and revising all the 40 course programs in the curriculum with the recent timely changes and completely adheres to Outcome Based Education. The inculcation of value-added courses, the diverse course programs and nearly 1038 courses with global competency, employability/ entrepreneurship/ skill development has been able to complement and enrich the prescribed curriculum.
- Academic flexibility: nearly 207 new courses were introduced in the curriculum this academic year across all the programs and all the 40 course programs offered in the institution follow CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) offering good academic flexibility to the students following the curriculum.
- Curriculum enrichment: The institution integrates cross-cutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability, and Human Values into the curriculum through various courses and academic activities held in the campus. There are 37 value-added courses offered by the institution for imparting life skills with a good number of student enrolment in each of the courses.

- The college also makes sure to enrich its curriculum through experiential learning methods like internships and field work as 2945 students were undergoing the same during this academic year.
- Feedback mechanism: The college follows a regular and systematised feedback mechanism. It has successfully collected the review of the syllabus from the students, teachers, employers and alumni through online methods. The feedback is duly collected, analysed and the action taken is made available in the college website. The IQAC committee and the feedback committee are functioning actively to implement the decision as per the suggestions received through the feedback.

## **CRITERIA 2**

With 7 major sub categories, the second criteria address the teaching-learning and evaluation procedures followed in the college. The following gives a brief report on the performance of the institution in this criterion:

- Student enrolment and profile: An exceptionally good number of students have enrolled in the institution this academic year and the college has been able to accommodate the OBC/SC/ST students also impartially despite the obstacles of the pandemic. The college committees have worked hard to ensure that the course programs offered are publicised and informed to the public attracting good enrolment of the students.
- Student diversity: The college acknowledges the diversity in every student and has initiated ample steps to ensure the inclusion of all categories of students in the academy. The categorization of students based on the primary entrance test enabling the teachers to identify student calibre and develop teaching methodologies as per the student needs is a praiseworthy step by the college. There are adequate orientations, bridge courses and activities designed and developed to address the needs of both slow and advanced learners. The student-teacher ratio is also maintained at a good rate to ensure good attention and guidance to the student diversity.
- Teaching-learning process: Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experience. The iLab studio for quality e-content, Qnsmart digital question bank system, Pearson's e-library and other academically relevant technological innovations has aided the college in uplifting its teaching-learning aspects. Apart from the academic matters, the college has also stayed consistent in the mental well-being of the students through the well-maintained mentor-mentee ratio and abiding by the scheduled academic calendar and teaching plans.
- Teacher profile and quality: There are 127 full time teachers against the sanctioned post this year and the number of faculty with specializations and doctorates have improved in comparison to the previous years.
- Evaluation process and reforms: The college has been able to maintain a healthy time span between the conduct of examination and the publication of results. Though there were grievances reported by the students regarding evaluation, the grievances were minor and satisfactorily resolved at minimum time and with good transparency. The college has tried to bring in specificity in the examination procedures through unique

IT integrated procedures that nullify errors and unnecessary duplicity. The adoption of ceiling system and decentralization of examinations during the pandemic are highlighted and admirable points of the institution.

- Student Performance and Learning Outcomes: The PO and CO for all Programmes offered by the institution are stated and displayed on the official website and duly communicated to teachers and students via induction programs, workshops and sessions organised by the IQAC of the college. The assessment procedures are good with orderly division of the internal and external assessments that are further evaluated through direct and indirect methods. The IQAC monitoring, academic audit and feedbacks from stakeholders has been noted to contribute immensely to the assessment process being carried out in the institution. This has led to a positive shift in the pass percentage of the students this academic year.
- Student Satisfaction Survey: The college values the satisfaction of its students and takes unfailing steps to ensure the satisfaction of the students by conducting the yearly Student Satisfaction Survey. The SSS was carried out efficiently this academic year and found to be satisfactory.

## **CRITERIA 3**

This criteria sheds light onto the potential of the institution in excelling in major three areas of research, extension activities and consultancy. The following points summarise the performance of the college during this academic year:

• Research promotion and facilities: The college promotes and constantly attempts to inspire its faculty and staff in taking up innovative and productive research activities. The research policies are well-maintained and there is an actively functioning research committee and GRACE (Guidance for Research and Assistance for Consultancy and Extension) that regularly gives orientation and the necessary support for research. A good amount of seed money is also funded by the institution supporting the cause of research. The campus is instilled with adequate infrastructural facilities and a well-equipped library for research purposes.

- Resource mobilization: This academic year, the college has been able to receive nearly 26 grants from Government and Non-Governmental agencies for research projects and endowments. The teachers have shown interest and taken up good research projects towards completion. The numbers of research guides and the departments having research projects funded by the government are average and can be further improved in the upcoming years.
- Innovation ecosystem: The institution has created a good ecosystem for innovations and creation and transfer of knowledge with the supportive programs and initiatives organised by active functioning of committees like IIC (Institution's Innovation Council), Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC), Entrepreneurship Development Club (ED club), Young Innovators Programme (YIP) etc. that organise and host events that promote entrepreneurial start-ups and innovations. It should be noted that nearly 57 programs were conducted during the academic year on Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Entrepreneurship and Skill Development during the year which is good leap in comparison to the previous years. The green initiatives of the college are judiciously maintained and highly commendable.
- Research Publications and awards: The college takes strict measures to ensure the quality of the research articles published from the institution with the help of the research and ethics committee that regularly give awareness sessions on plagiarism, code of ethics to be followed and the recent changes in the research methodologies. Research methodology is also a part of the curricular course work offered from the institution. 22 research candidates have registered with the institution for this academic year and the steps are being taken to increase the number in the upcoming years. The citation index and the h-index is also good for this academic year.

- Consultancy: The consultancy activities of the college has faced a setback due to the pandemic and hence the institution could not exert its potential in this arena. Yet, the revenue generated through consultancy and the expenditure for developing the consultancy activities have been maintained.
- Extension activities: the extension activities of the college is coordinated through an active social wing of the college- Jossine Reach. The unit has been successful in sensitising the students on the prime areas of gender, community health environmental protection and disaster and pandemic response activities. The activities of the college during the pandemic were highly substantial for the community and instilling the value of social commitment among the students. The NSS and NCC units of the college has also been dynamic in organising community and environment beneficial programs. There was good student involvement in the programs organised and the units were capable of achieving recognition through various awards at different levels.
- Collaboration: The college understands the need to expand its reach beyond its campus walls and hence has taken good attempts at securing collaborative bonds with various organization and institutes of repute. Nearly 1331 collaborative activities were held and 30 MoUs were signed this year promising a wide range of education and career opportunities for the students.

# **CRITERIA 4**

The infrastructure and learning resources are the basic necessity in any educational institute. The lockdown became a boon for the institution in progressing with the infrastructural developments as it barely hindered the academics of the students. The following points summarise the developments and progress mage by the institution during the academic year of 2020-2021:

- Physical facilities: The college witnessed very good initiation for infrastructural developments this year. The classrooms and facilities of the college were upgraded to encompass the new modes of online/blended learning. More investments were done towards technological advancements making the college technologically competent in academics as well as in administration. The college has also spared equal attention in developing and maintaining the sports facilities in the campus.
- Library: Reckoning the high demand for e-reference materials during the pandemic, the college has invested in purchasing more e-reference materials for the library which shall be upgraded soon. The college library works on the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) 'Koha' and had the students and faculty are able to access its resources despite the pandemic.
- IT infrastructure: The most exquisite IT upgradation of the college during this academic year is QnSmart- the digital question bank system. This has eased the examination procedures and has seen to produce good reviews. Apart from QnSmart, the ILMS 'Koha' and the LMS of the college LINWAYS are duly updated and utilized effectively. These facilities are also made available to the students for study purposes.

• Maintenance of infrastructure: There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities and all of these facilities are well organised and functioning properly. Adequate funds were released during this academic year for maintenance purposes and these are being monitored via committees and groups specifically working for this cause.

# CRITERIA 5

Students form the basic population of any educational institution and regularly pacing with the needs and requirements of this population keeps the institution perceptive to the needs of the new generation. This aspect was new challenge for the institution as the students were approached only through virtual means. The following gives an estimate of the efforts indulged by the institution in this direction:

- Student Support: A very good number of students benefitted by the scholarships and freeships provided by the Government during the year and it is good to record that a good number of students were supported through the institutional schemes and scholarships provided by non-governmental agencies. Utilizing the benefits of the virtual world, the institution could hold a good number of capacity building and skills enhancement programs for the students spread equally in the areas of Soft Skills, language and communication skills, life skills, Yoga, physical fitness, health and hygiene and awareness of trends in technology under the guideship of excellent resource persons irrespective of the geographical distance. The Institution has a transparent mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances including sexual harassment and ragging cases that fall under the jurisdiction of the anti-sexual harassment committee and the anti-ragging committee that give regular awareness classes and orientation classes in the beginning and during the academic year. The grievance redressal procedures are carried out impartially and the grievances are addressed satisfactorily.
- Student progression and participation in activities: With good guidance and orientation, the institution has got exceptionally good number of students opting for higher studies this academic year. The coaching for competitive examinations was conducted without fail through online means. Despite the pandemic, the student involvement and participation in campus activities can also be counted as good. This points to the highly functional and active student union in the campus that reflects its presence in all the administrative and academic decision-making bodies of the campus. 149 sports and cultural events were hosted by the institution and it recorded good student participation in all of them.

This year the alumnae engagement is beyond commendable with its unmatched contribution by supporting the students (A Phone to Learn) who have financial constraints in attending online classes. They have also shown their goodwill through their contribution for the infrastructural developments of the institution.

# **CRITERIA 6**

Keeping in mind absolute fulfilment of the vision and mission, the institution indulges in a transparent and decentralised mode of governance. The details of which are listed as below:

- Institutional vision and leadership: In order to attain the desired goals mentioned in the vision and mission of the college, the institution has divided and decentralised the decision-making procedures to undergo multiple layer filtration and complete participation enabling implementation of the best decision in the best possible manner and under direct monitoring for effectiveness. There is a highly organised layer of decision-making bodies in the college that meet regularly to supervise and review the working of the institution. The proceedings of these meetings are also documented carefully for reference. The open gym, renovation in the library and other admirable changes in the institution are a result of this decentralised procedure.
- Strategy development and deployment: The strategic plan document 2013-2023 is clearly articulated and adhered with short term and long-term goals commonly decided and approved for attainment. The institution has been able to justify the plans for this year through its investing its efforts in improving the teaching-learning quality and increasing the use of ICT. E-governance is successfully employed in academic, administrative and accounting levels.
- Faculty Empowerment Strategies: The college acknowledges the services of its teaching and non-teaching staff and provides them with adequate welfare options starting from supporting the education of their children to other financial benefits and options for career development. The teaching staff are funded adequately to refine their teaching strategies by institutional supported participation in workshops and conferences. 127 teachers have undergone online/ face-to-face Faculty Development Programmes during the year which is a great leap in comparison to the previous years.
- Financial Management and Resource Mobilization: Both the internal and external audits have been successfully held during this year. Funds have been mobilised from

non-government bodies, individuals, and philanthropists during the year for various chartered purposes. All the financial transactions are documented and well-accounted.

• IQAC: The IQAC of the institution is highly active and shares the responsibility in every aspect of institutional working. Some of the exceptional works of the IQAC this year was the conduct of academic and administrative audit. The IQAC is a decentralised committee with representatives from each level of the institutional set up contributing their share of presence in supervising the quality endeavours of the college. The committee members regularly meet and the decisions are documented neatly in the minutes book. The IQAC played a commendable role in maintaining the teaching-learning quality during the pandemic by organising workshop and seminars for acquainting the teacher-student community with the changes. The initiation of several beneficial infrastructural and technological advancements were also some noteworthy acts of IQAC during this academic year.

#### **CRITERIA 7**
