The Department of Zoology

Stingless-beekeeping [Meliponiculture]

The Department of Zoology at St. Joseph's (Autonomous) College organized a skill development program on "Stingless Beekeeping Training" at the Padma Bhushan Fr. Gabriel Seminar Hall at St. Joseph's College on 7th September 2024. The inaugural address was delivered by Prof. (Retd.) Dr. Sajan Jose K., Director of Regal Bee Gardens Beekeeping Training Centre, Kanjir, Idukki, also



conducted sessions on various types of bees and honey collection methods. Dr. Sr. Blessy (Principal, St. Joseph's College, Irinjalakuda) presided over the event. The program was attended by students, farmers, and members of the public, who gained insights into stingless beekeeping and its potential in the agricultural sector. Stingless bee honey is valuable. Hence through this training session, the department intended to train the local community around the nearby area and the students to start their own culture.

Students participated in the PRA Training under Mr. Guruvayoorappan, a Social Scientist, and Carried out the PRA Study at Parayamballam Village which comes under

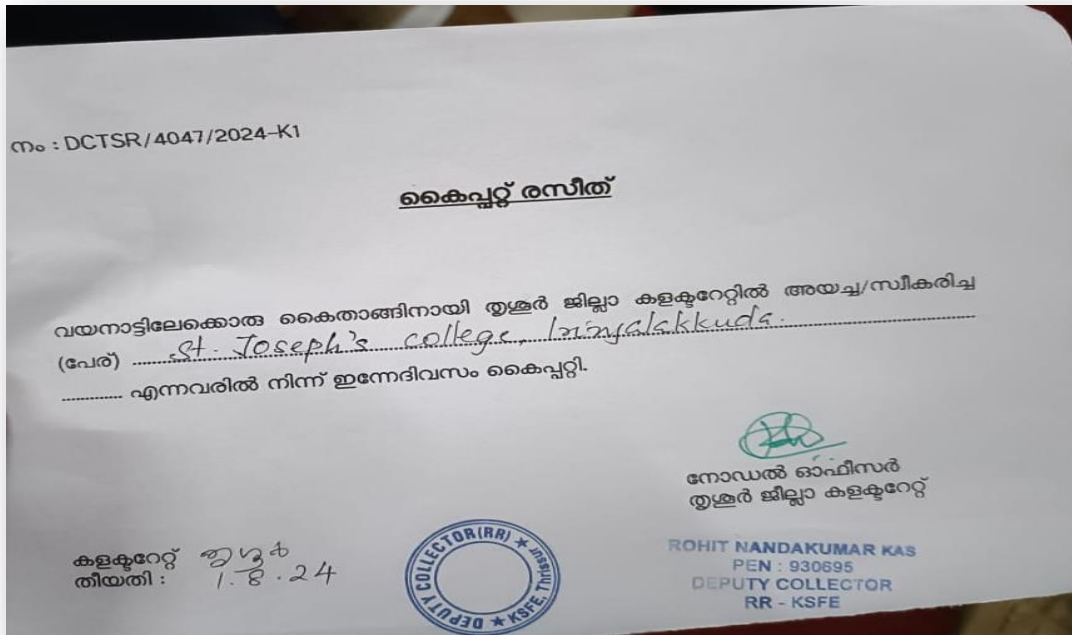

Irinjalakuda. About 60 students participated in the program. The mental health of each student was assessed through a psychological questionnaire.

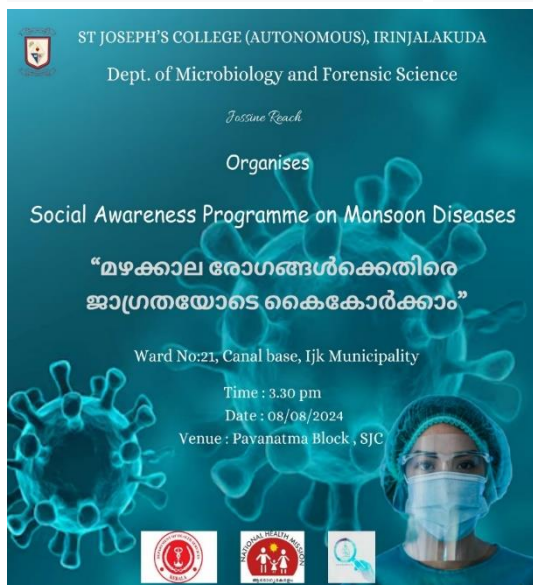


Department of Microbiology and Forensic Science

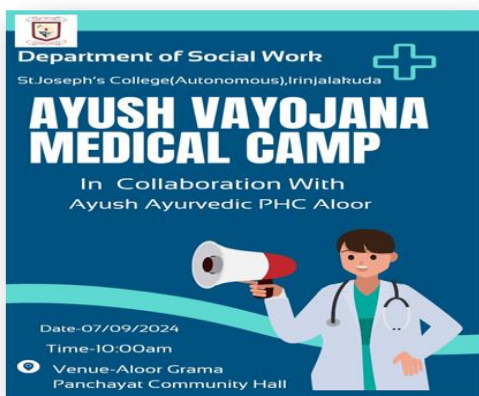
the Pavanathma Block, St. Joseph’s College (Autonomous), Irinjalakuda. The primary objective of the session was to educate residents of the ward no. 21, Irinjalakuda about common monsoon-related diseases and their preventive measures. During the session, students and faculties of the department provided information on major monsoon diseases, including malaria, chikungunya, dengue fever, Leptospirosis, Amoebiasis, cholera, typhoid, Nipah and Hepatitis A. They explained the symptoms and causes of these diseases and informed participants about effective preventive measures. Approximately 30 residents attended the program. Additionally, students



created posters and placards to enhance further awareness.

Ayush Vayojana Medical Camp (07/09/2024)

In collaboration with Ayush Ayurvedic PHC Aloor, the social work trainee organized an Ayurvedic Medical Camp for Elderly People. The program was inaugurated by Mr. K R Jojo President of Aloor Grama Panchayat and promoted the importance and the benefits of Ayurveda. The Social work trainee volunteered for the program by setting up the auditorium, helping in the registration process, etc.
