

## **Election 2025-26**

### **Instructions to Candidates**

1. For class election nomination should be filed for the post of **class representative only**.
2. Proposer and Secunder should be from the same class for class election Nomination
3. UG students must be of the age limit between 17 to 22.
4. PG students must below 25 years of age.
5. Should have attendance of 73%
6. Shouldn't have any supplementary papers in any previous semester to clear
7. Class rep election, if any, will be held on 9<sup>th</sup> October from 9.30 AM to 9:45AM
8. Those who win can contest for Union election

(NCC-elected by NCC, NSS-elected by NSS, Women Cell-elected by women cell, AICUF-elected by AICUF)
10. Elected Class Representatives should report in Auditorium on **9<sup>th</sup> October, 10:00 AM**
11. Elected class representative should file fresh nominations to contest for union election.
12. All those who wish to do this should bring rupees 50 and a passport size photograph.
13. One student can file nomination for only one post. (Since association secretary is part of college union, she can't compete for any other post)

14. Each candidate should be proposed and seconded by an elector each.
15. No student shall propose more than one person for the same post.
16. No student shall second more than one person for the same post.
17. One person can propose and second only one person for the same post
18. A person who has proposed another person for a post shall not second another candidate for the same post. (ie, a person who has proposed one candidate for chairman post shall not second another one for the same post.)
19. A person who has proposed one person for one post may second another one for a different post.
20. A candidate nominated for a post shall not propose or second another person for the same post.
21. Those who wish to withdraw nomination may do that in the prescribed format. Withdrawal once made will be final.
22. III DC students can't stand for magazine editor post.
23. Mark 'X' in the ballot paper
24. ID card is compulsory during union Election
25. Either the candidate or a representative (agent) chosen by the candidate to be present at the time of counting.
26. Association secretaries and NSS, NCC, AICUF and Women Cell members should participate in the investiture ceremony.

### **Code of Conduct for Candidates**

1. No candidate is allowed to make use of printed posters, pamphlets or any other material for canvassing.
2. Only handmade posters should be used.
3. Should not use gum, cello tape or nails to fix posters on the walls.
4. Meetings or processions organized for canvassing should not disturb the classes and other academic and co-curricular activities.
5. Students should take prior permission from the authority to hold such events.
6. The maximum permitted expenditure per candidate for canvassing is Rs.5000. The candidate should bear the expense.
7. Persons outside from the college should not be allowed to take part in canvassing.
8. Students should not arrange any canvassing meetings or events in the campus during working hours.
9. All corrupt practices such as bribing, threatening or impersonation of voters are prohibited.
- 10.No candidate shall indulge in any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic, or between any group(s) of students
- 11.There shall be no appeal to caste or communal feelings for securing votes. Places of worship, within or without the campus shall not be used for election propaganda
- 12.Candidates shall refrain from criticism of all aspects of private life, not connected with the public activities of the other candidates or supporters of such other candidates.
- 13.The use of loudspeakers, vehicles and animals for the purpose of canvassing shall be prohibited
- 14.Candidates should stop public campaigning 24 hours before the hour of polling.
